

State Crisis Group

First Meeting - August 24, 1998

1. The first meeting of the State Crisis Group was held on August 24, 1998 under the Chairmanship of the Chief Secretary. A list of other members of the State Crisis Group and officials who were present in the meeting is annexed.

2. Secretary, Labour welcomed all members to the first meeting of the State Crisis Group and explained the role and functions of the State Crisis Group. The Labour Commissioner made a presentation regarding Industrial Disaster Management, the Legislative frame-work and the provisions regarding preparation of On-site and Off-site Emergency Plans and constitution of Crisis Groups.

3. STATUS REPORT

The following report regarding the current status of preparedness was presented to the State Crisis Group :-

- 3.1. District Crisis Groups for 45 Districts have been constituted and meeting of these groups have been held.
- 3.2. Instructions have been issued for constitution of District Crisis Groups for 16 new Districts.
- 3.3. The Local Crisis Groups for 4 Industrial Areas - Pithampur (Dhar), Mandideep (Raisen), Malanpur (Bhind) and Urla (Raipur) have also been constituted and meetings of these groups have been held.
- 3.4. As on 01/08/98, there are 77 Major Accident Hazard (MAH) Units located in 22 districts of the State. These districts are required to formulate District Off-site Plans. So far 19 districts have already formulated Off-site Plans. New MAH Units have come up in 3 districts recently. Concerned District Collectors have been instructed to formulate Off-site Plans.

Off-site Plans have also been formulated for 7 Districts which have no Major Accident Hazard Units.

District Off-site plans will be scrutinized by Chief Inspector of Factories and will be put-up for evaluation in the next meeting of the State Crisis Group.

- 3.5. All the 77 Major Accident Hazard Units in the State have prepared and submitted their On-site Plans for approval of Chief Inspector of Factories. 62 Plans have already been scrutinized and approved and 15 plans are being processed.
- 3.6. Under Section 41-B, Factories Act, 1948, 623 units have been identified as liable to prepare and submit On-site Plans. So far 423 such plans have been scrutinized and approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories.

4. DECISIONS

After review of the current status of preparedness, various key issues for strengthening the Industrial Disaster Management System were discussed and the following decisions were taken.

- 4.1. On-site Plans for the remaining 15 Major Accident Hazard Units be scrutinised and finalised by 30/10/98.
- 4.2. Off-site Plans for all 22 MAH districts be revised and finalised by 31/03/99.
- 4.3. Off-site Plans which have been finalised be put-up for review in the next State Crisis Group meeting.
- 4.4. Detailed list of all District Crisis Group / Local Crisis Group members, including nominated members, be compiled.
- 4.5. For nomination of Experts, a panel of experts be proposed.
- 4.6. Legal provision regarding liability of Hazardous units for operation / implementation of Off-site Plans be examined. Additional provisions, if necessary be proposed.

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4.7. Proposal for strengthening Directorate of Industrial Health and Safety be put up separately.

✓4.8. Disaster Management Institute & Pollution Control Board may be facilitators for organising Training & Awareness programmes to be funded by Industries, Environment and Labour Departments and user Industry Groups.

4.9. It may be proposed that in District Crisis Groups, in place of Transport Commissioner, and Controller of Explosives; their representatives may be made members.

✓4.10. Inspection Reports of Hazardous units be put-up for information to concerned District Crisis Groups / Local Crisis Groups by Factory Inspectors.
