
The Govt. of India has developed a self-regulatory mechanism for industries and, as part of compliance, the industries have installed real-time monitoring systems, including online continuous emission monitoring systems (OCEMS), at their establishments and have provided credentials to the MPPCB to access the real-time data. A mechanism has to be established to ensure reliability and accuracy of data being received at our end.

In view of above, it is required to incorporate the following conditions in the Consent/Renewal of Consent Letter, to be issued to all such industries covered under 17 categories and Grossly Polluting category, for necessary compliance :

1. Facility for calibration of Real-time monitoring systems should be available at the industry end.
2. Instruments should be periodically calibrated & calibration data should be entered automatically into the system through the software installed at industry end.
3. Remote calibration facility should be available at each gaseous OCEMS.

A report on compliance status of calibration facility by industries, under your jurisdiction, is expected within a month's time for review and onward action.
